

# Religion Minor



## Course of Study

Imagine a course of study around a theme focused on your interests. Complete five courses, fulfilling a few conditions:

- at least four must be offered by the Department of Religion
- must show breadth (courses cannot all be focused on a single area of study such as one religious tradition or region)
- must show depth (at least two should focus on the same area of study)

## Research Symposium

After completing coursework, students participate in a research symposium in the spring, presenting a project of their choice to each other, Religion majors, and members of the Religion faculty.

## Final Reflections

Before graduating, all minors complete a reflection paper narrating their coursework in the minor and describing how that work has related to their major and/or other aspects of their time at Princeton.
